TOURNAMENT RULES

RULES & REGULATIONS

• Play Format

Stroke Play (18 Holes)

• Tee-off

Men: White Tee

Ladies: Red Tee

• Tournament Flights and Handicap

Category Men A: Handicap 0-12

Category Men B: Handicap 13-28

Category Ladies: Handicap 0-28

• Scoring System

Player's handicap is determined using System 36.
The Stableford scoring is then used to calculate player's points.

Stableford Point Index:			
• 2 or more over Adjusted par	-	0	point
• 1 over Adjusted par	-	1	point
• Adjusted Par	-	2	points
• 1 under Adjusted par	-	3	points
• 2 under Adjusted par	-	4	points
• 3 under Adjusted par	-	5	points
• 4 under Adjusted par	-	6	points

Par value of each hole will be adjusted in accordance with a player's handicap and a golf course hole difficulty handicap scale. The above scoring system table will be used to calculate a point for each hole which then will be summed up to get a total net point. The player who scores the most points will be the winner of his or her flight category.

For example:

- A player on a handicap of 7 will add one shot to the par value of each hole with a stroke index of 1 to 7. A par 3 would become a calculated par 4 for that player. (Par 3 will be 4, Par 4 will be 5).
- A player on a handicap of 18 will add one shot to the par value of every hole
- A player on a handicap of 24 will add one shot to the par value of every hole and extra 2 shots to the par value of each hole with a stroke index of 1 to 6.

• Rules, Qualification, and Decision

- BMW GOLF CUP is an amateur tournament. Professional golfers are not allowed to participate in BMW GOLF CUP tournaments. If a professional golfer is allowed to participate in the tournament in a limiting case, the professional golfer is not eligible for any prize.
- Participation in BMW GOLF CUP 2025 Qualifying round is a one-time opportunity.
- The employees of BMW (Thailand) Company Limited and those involved in organizing BMW GOLF CUP 2025 events including employees, dealers, organizers, suppliers, as well as the relatives of the above mentioned, are allowed to take part in the qualifying tournaments; however, they are not officially scored and are

therefore, unable to qualify for the National Final and the World Final. In compliance with BMW's policy, this rule also applies to members of the media and members of partnering organizations invited by BMW.

- The winner will be determined using the Stableford scoring system.
- In the event of a tie, the player with lower handicap will be the winner. If both player handicap are the same, the player with lower gross score will be the winner. If the gross score is still equal, the retrogression count back will commence from the 18th hole.
- Only BMW car owner and client of specific authorized dealer is eligible to qualify to the National Final round.
- The winner and a runner-up of each individual category will be qualified for the National Final round. If a qualified player is unable to take part in the National Final round, the next best-scoring player in the qualifying tournament then takes the place.
- The winners in each of the three categories (Men A, Men B, and Ladies) of the National Final round are qualified to take part in the World Final.
- BMW GOLF CUP WORLD FINAL is a once-in-a-lifetime golf experience, therefore a golfer who ever participated in the World Final is not eligible to take part in the World Final again.
- Each score card needs to be signed by a player and a marker before submission.
- Please write only numbers, not any symbol, in a score card.
- Please strictly follow local and standard rules of a golf course.
- A scorecard that is not submitted within 30 minutes after a completion of the round will be considered as "NON-RETURNED".
- In case of any circumstances that may result in a round not being completed, scoring will be judged by the tournament committee.
- If a player would like to contest a tournament score, an appeal must be made to the tournament committee within 30 minutes after completion of the round. The tournament committee's decision is considered final.
- Only amateur golfers are eligible to receive any prize.
- The player must be 18 years or over on the tournament day to be eligible to advance to the National Final.
- The player must hold an amateur status according to Thailand Golf Association to be qualified to the National Final.
- A player who violates the rules and regulations of the tournament will be disqualified.
- The winner of a Hole-in-One prize valued higher than 1,000 baht is responsible for the payment of the 5% withholding tax upon receiving the prize.
- The conditions for awarding the Hole-in-One prize are determined by the sponsor.

• Trophy Prizes

- Winner (Category Men A, Men B, and Ladies)
- Runner up (Category Men A, Men B, and Ladies)
